1. All entries must have been published in a New Zealand legal publication between 1 January 2022 and 31 December 2022.
2. All entries must be on the Official Entry Form and submitted in **hard copy**. Entries submitted electronically will not be accepted.
3. All questions must be answered, incomplete entry forms will not be accepted.
4. All entries must be accompanied by a **hard copy** of the article, preferably in its published form (electronic copies will not be accepted).
5. Where journals are provided, these will be returned if accompanied by a stamped addressed envelope or pre-paid courier bag.
6. Entries for the award open on Tuesday 4 April 2023 and close on Friday 30 June 2023. Entries received before or after these dates will not be accepted.
7. The number of entries from a single contributor or group of contributors is not limited, however, each entry must be submitted on the Official Entry Form.
8. Publishers may submit entries on behalf of authors however, each entry must still be accompanied by a fully completed Official Entry Form.
