

Commercial and Business Law Committee – Terms of Reference

The Commercial and Business Law Committee is a law reform committee established by the New Zealand Law Society Board to:

1. Monitor and comment on proposals for legislative, regulatory, or other change in the area of commercial and business law.
2. Work collaboratively with other law reform committees where there are areas of mutual interest and expertise.
3. Provide advice to the President and Board of the New Zealand Law Society on issues relating to commercial and business law.
4. Alongside the in-house Law Reform & Advocacy Team, maintain good working relationships with key stakeholders. This may include attending meetings with Government departments, participating on working groups, and working with other representative organisations.
5. Engage with commercial and business lawyers across Aotearoa/the various regions to better understand issues which impact access to justice, and issues affecting commercial and business lawyers.

Collectively, the Committee should have a broad mix of experience across commercial and business law practice.
